**W3 professorship for haematology, oncology and stem cell transplantation**  
(Succession Prof. Dr. med. Th. Fischer)

starting October 1st, 2021.

The tasks include the representation of the subject in research, teaching and patient care and the management of the University Hospital for Haematology, Oncology and Stem Cell Transplantation.

In addition to outstanding clinical experience and scientific achievements in the field, the applicant is expected to make a significant contribution to the further development of the two research foci of the Medical Faculty (Neurosciences; Immunology/Molecular Medicine of Inflammation) and the associated collaborative projects (SFBs, GRKs, etc.).

The Clinic for Haematology and Oncology is an integral part of the "Centre for Internal Medicine" with medical rotation possibilities for internal specialist training. The obligatory service tasks include the active organization of interdisciplinary cooperation with other clinics, institutes and centers of university medicine in the field of oncology, a central participation in the Comprehensive Cancer Center (CCC), which is currently being established, as well as the active co-design of the Health Campus Immunology, Infectiology and Inflammation (GC-I<sup>3</sup>).

Applicants are expected to show a particularly high level of commitment to teaching in the human medicine course of study and to participate in the biomedically oriented Bachelor's and Master's courses of study at the Faculty of Medicine or the University.

Requirements for employment are the "Habilitation" or equivalent scientific achievements as well as the recognition as a medical specialist.

The tasks of managing the clinic in connection with the professorship, including the associated liquidation law, are regulated by a senior physician contract. In the contract, the tasks associated with the management of the clinic, including the treatment of private patients, are assigned to the service tasks. The previous liquidation law will be replaced by performance-related remuneration. This can be waived if a professor has already been entitled to liquidation.

Candidates with disabilities and essentially equal qualifications and professional achievements will be given preference. The Otto-von-Guericke-University is committed to increase the number of women in scientific fields and strongly encourages female scientists to apply for this position.

The Otto-von-Guericke University aims to increase the proportion of women at all stages of an academic career and therefore strongly encourages female academics to apply.

Applications from severely handicapped persons will be given preferential consideration if they have the same aptitude, aptitude and professional qualifications.
